AN OVERVIEW OF THE CHINIOT ISLAMIA PUBLIC SCHOOL

1. With a rich inherited tradition of service to the nation, Chiniot Anjuman Islamia, Karachi, was founded and registered in 1984 so as to pursue the mission of serving the nation, particularly in the fields of education and health. The main objective to develop this institution was to nurture the innate faculties of a child in order to make him an intelligent, well-groomed and creative adult with all requisite quality of head and heart tempered with our values.
2. The Anjuman, therefore, decided to establish an educational institution based on the principles of Islamic teachings blended with modern concepts in the field of education in order to meet the challenges of today's fast track world. For the realization of this aim the Anjuman acquired, from KDA, a two acre plot on the Main University Road to establish a purpose-built school to provide quality education from pre-primary to the secondary level at an affordable cost. This ambitious project was completed with resources made available by the philanthropist members of the Anjuman. An Executive Committee formed under the Chiniot Anjuman Islamia, frames policies and sets directions in addition to monitoring the progress of the institution through a constant liaison with the school administration.
3. The school is a purely service-oriented venture and is run on 'Not for Profit' basis. The focus of Chiniot Islamia Public School is to provide quality education at an affordable cost with a pledge to achieve excellence through education. The cherished goal of this institution is to create its own distinctive character by maintaining high standards in scholastics and to produce excellent result in the S.S.C/H.S.C Boards and O' level examinations. We lay special emphasis on character building so as to produce highly motivated and fully equipped future leaders who should also be the patriotic Pakistanis and devout Muslims.
4. True to its given mission Chiniot Islamia Public School has been achieving very impressive results in the Secondary School Certificate (Matric) held by Karachi Board of Secondary Education as can be seen in the result synopsis of the last few years placed at Annex "A". This indeed is the result of the dedication of teaching faculty, the hard work of the students, the supervision of the parents and indeed the standards set and guidance provided by the members of the Executive Committee of the school. Alhamdulillah, our Karachi Board and a Cambridge University. O'Level Exams portray an enormous success story which strengthens our determination to strive and achieve still higher levels of excellence.
5. The Executive committee of the school holds its quarterly meetings in order to review various projects and to monitor the progress in the academics and other allied affairs



PREMISES

Chiniot Islamia Public School is located in Block No. 7 of Gulshan-e - Iqbal on a two acre amenity plot on Main University Road, Karachi, opposite to the city's Safari Park. The block that houses the Montessori Section was completed first and teaching commenced in 1986. Immediately after, the Junior Section building was made ready and classes from first to fifth started in 1987. The Lower Secondary Section building was commissioned in 1988 and in the same year sixth, seventh and eighth classes teaching began. Now we have classes from MONTESSORI JUNIOR to XII and O' Levels.

PRE-PRIMARY SECTION

Besides many other renovations, our Pre-Primary Section has also been segregated this year, now it works as a domain where stress is laid on the Activity – based learning and enhancing the performance of the Section. Our dedicated Section Head and faculty are putting their best efforts to make this institution an exemplary place of learning.

CLASS ROOMS & SCIENCE LABORATORIES

The building now comprises three blocks, i.e. the MONTESSORI / GIRLS Section, JUNIOR Section, LOWER Secondary and COLLEGE Section. All sections originally had three floors each ground plus two. An additional floor was constructed in Junior Section in 2008. In the year 2011 a floor was added in Senior /Lower Secondary Section and still recently third floor is added in the girls section which has completed in May, 2018. The class rooms are purpose-built- spatial and airy with adequate cross ventilation and are furnished with proper furniture, fixtures and fittings, thus creating an environment conducive to learning. The building has a separate Administration Block which contains offices, a multipurpose hall, a spacious Library and laboratories for Physics and Chemistry. Biology laboratory is on the ground floor of the Senior Secondary Section.

COMPUTER LABORATORIES

The school has extensive and well equipped wirelessly networked computer labs featuring with modern Intel core i3 computers huge files storage capacity, printing and internet facility. Wireless and DSL internet connections have been provided for better communication. These laboratories have been recently upgraded with latest equipment to meet the ever increasing needs in IT education.

Resource Room and Demo Room

A "Resource Room "has been set up in order to enhance and enrich the teaching and learning experience environment for the faculty. It has well equipped wirelessly network modern 'Intel core i3, eight computer systems with printing, scanning and high speed internet facility. Wireless internet connection has been provided to all the eight computer stations for the best communication. It is specially designed for the teachers in order to improve their teaching skills, lesson planning, ability to accommodate varied learning styles and latest international teaching methods. "Demo Room" with 'Interactive' Smart Board, Multimedia and allied audio video facilities is set up in order to provide 'State of the Art' facilities for the demo lectures/ presentations.

LIBRARY

A spatial library containing over 14000 books, covering various disciplines general and subject- specific, is maintained according to the Dewey's Decimal System. All books can searched online for title, author including page of content. The library subscribes to a number of newspapers, magazines. For young student of junior classes, a junior library is maintained where the library teachers read them the stories from the library books. It motivates them in order to develop in them the habit of reading books. A reference library is also kept with encyclopedias, dictionaries, reference material, charts, maps, CDs PC, multimedia projector, OHP etc. for the use of the faculty and students. Regular library periods are provided in the timetable for the students.

FACULTY

CANTEEN & TUCK SHOP

The School has vast open space within its boundaries that houses a Canteen cum Tuck Shop with photocopying facility. Quality edibles, text books, stationery and other items are available at reasonable prices.

MOSQUE

The School has fully functional "Jamia Masjid" which also serves the nearby population. Arrangements are made to hold Zohar Prayers in the mosque and students are motivated to offer Zohar prayers in congregation.

PLAY AREA

Space is available within the compound for outdoor games and activities. Table Tennis, Badminton, Cricket and Soft Ball facilities are available.

MINI AUDITORIUM

A Mini Auditorium with a seating capacity of 250 persons is available for various functions, lectures and other collective activities.

SICK ROOM

A well- equipped sick room with a very experienced and qualified nurse looks after the medical emergencies. The sick room caters for all emergencies and first aid requirements.

TRANSPORT

The institution is located on Main University Road where public transport ply in large number. Parents are free to coordinate transporter for their wards under own arrangements.

ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF

The team of efficient and committed administrative, accounts and other support staff work for the maintenance, upkeep of the records, documents and the premises so as to facilitate the teachers and the students in optimizing their time and also to provide them conducive environment.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF CIPS

Following aspects of education of a child are given special attention:

- a. Development of personal qualities like honesty, integrity, self-discipline, diligence etc. through appreciation, affection, reward and indoctrination.
- b. Development of individual qualities like co-operation, tolerance, sociability etc. by proper motivation and guidance both in and out of the classroom.
- c. Inculcating leadership qualities like initiative, power of decision, self-confidence, by providing opportunities to hold appointments as class monitors, prefects and other offices of responsibility.
- d. Detection and elimination of the negative traits of personality like selfishness, violence, cheating, resort to short cuts, indiscipline and the like through methodical observation followed by counseling and correction.
- e. Development of curiosity, creative thinking and sense of inquiry.
- f. Development of sense of pride, quest for excellence and achievement through healthy competition between individuals as well as groups in academics, sports and other co-curricular activities.
- g. Development of leadership qualities like power of expression and general awareness through co-curricular activities, excursions and study tours.
- h. To attain these objectives parents have an important role to play and every endeavor is made to keep them informed about the progress of their wards. They are also expected to liaise with the school frequently. Parents / teachers meetings are arranged at regular intervals.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & VISITORS

Following points are for the general information of the parents seeking admission of their wards:

- a. All admissions are subject to qualifying written test / interview.
- b. Tuition fee & transport charges are to be paid by 15th of each month online in designated Banks / TCS / Easy Paise outlets online. A fine of Rs. 100 is levied after 15th of each month. This is valid up to 25th of the current month. No challan will be issued after 25th of the month. However, fine of Rs. 300/- will be levied in the fee challan of the next month.
- c. In case of two months nonpayment of fees the name of your ward will be struck off from the school roll.
- d. Visiting hours for the Principal are 10:00 to 11:30 hours on all working days except Friday.
- e. Absence beyond two weeks without information / cogent reason will result into expulsion of the student from the school.
- f. Students with less than 75% attendance during the academic year will not be allowed to appear in the examination.
- g. Students without proper uniform, haircut or not in possession of books will not be allowed to attend the classes.
- h. Disorderly / objectionable behavior will be liable to expulsion from the school.
- i. Late comers will be fined Rs. 50/- per day.



CODE OF CONDUCT

All students must observe the school rules in letter and spirit within the school premises as well as during official visits to other institutions or places. Violation of rules makes students liable corrective action. Students admitted to the school will abide by the following rules:

- a. Students shall be neatly dressed in the prescribed uniform and conduct themselves gracefully both in and outside the school premises. They should be courteous towards the teaching and other staff members as well as fellow students and visitors. They shall accept responsibilities willingly as and when given by staff / prefects and accept corrective actions, if any, cheerfully.
- b. Boys will have a neat gentlemanly haircut and girls simple hair-do. Girls are not to put on jewelry / ornaments / make-up. They may use headscarf in and out of the classroom.
- c. Students will be regular and punctual in attending all periods, organized activities and morning assembly.
- d. After arrival in the school no pupil is allowed to leave without the specific permission of concerned Headmaster / Headmistress or Principal.
- e. In the event of the need to leave the school earlier due to illness or any urgent personal matter, his / her parent / guardian may take their ward after due permission from the concern Head of Section.
- f. It is mandatory for all students to attend at least 75% of periods in each subject, failing which; they will not be allowed to sit for any annual examination of the school. The students shall be responsible for completion of their class work / practical's in case of their absence from the school/class for whatever reason.
- g. Leave of absence is to be got sanctioned in advance on a proper application. For leave on account of sickness, the absentees upon return must produce a medical certificate or an application duly endorsed by parents / guardians.
- h. **Possession & usage of cigarette / paan / niswar / gotka and other such items are strictly prohibited.**
- i. **Students are not allowed to bring expensive items like camera, CDs, mobile telephone, personal or family belongings as these will be confiscated and will be returned after having been charged a fine of Rs. 500/- through bank challan.**
- j. Students are not allowed to visit classes / sections to which they do not belong.
- k. Students shall protect school property. Any deliberate and willful effort to damage / deface / steal the property will be treated as a serious breach of discipline. Compensation of the damage in addition to fine will be imposed if anyone found guilty. Serious cases may entail expulsion / rustication from the school.
- l. Students must qualify all class tests, terminal and annual examinations. Failing in annual exam twice in a class will qualify for automatic expulsion from the school.
- m. Students are not allowed to enter the school without uniform beyond the Reception Desk.
- n. Parents may contact Information Desk / Reception for any query on telephone numbers given at the back page.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Following is the procedure for admission:

- Admission is allowed to boys in classes MONTESSORI JUNIOR to class VIII & in class VI to VII in O'level in morning shift. Girls are also admitted in class VI to VIII in Morning Shift, depending on availability of seats.
- Admission to 1st year is granted to boys & girls on the basis of their Board result & admission test in Pre-Engineering and Pre-Medical groups only.
- Both the parents are required to be present during the interview.
- Applications for admission are received online. The prospectus is available from the school office on payment of Rs. 500/-. Application form can be accessed at www.chiniotschool.edu.pk/admission-form-2024-2025
- The admission test is based on the level of the preceding class in the subjects of English, Math, and Urdu from MONTESSORI to VIII, and only English and Math for O'level students.
- Admissions are also given in the junior classes, MONTESSORI JUNIOR to class V in the afternoon shift to boys and girls. Students will be transferred to Morning Shift after Class V
SPECIAL CONCESSION IN ADMISSION AND MONTHLY TUTION FEE IS GRANTED TO THE CHILDREN SEEKING ADMISSION IN THE AFTERNOON SHIFT.
- Pass marks for admission tests are 40% in each subject and 50% in each subject for O'Levels.
- The right of admission is reserved.

FEES

The details of fee charged may be obtained from the Accounts Section.

The rules governing the fees are as under:

ONLINE FEE PAYMENT SYSTEM

- a. Fee will be paid online in designated **Banks / TCS / Easy Paisa** Outlets.
- b. Kuick pay platform has now been incorporated in shape of digital payment.
- c. There is no need for parents to get the printed fee vouchers. Fee can now be paid from the comfort of their homes.
- d. All dues must be cleared before 15th of the current month. Late fee at the rate of Rs. 100/- will be charged from 16 to 25th the current month. Fee challan will stand cancelled on 25th of the current month. No challan will be issued after 25th of the month. However, fine of Rs.300/- will be levied in the fee challan of the next month.
- e. If the dues are not cleared for consecutive two months the student's name is struck off the school roll.
- f. Full fee is charged from the first month of the session i.e. Montessori to Matric and O'Level from 1st April to March and from 1st August for class XI & XII.
- g. Full fee is charged for the month in which the withdrawal/migration of a student is affected for any reason whatsoever. However, application for withdrawal or migration is required to be given at least one month in advance.
- h. **Dues once paid are not refunded except security deposit. Security deposit can be claimed within one year after leaving the school by the student. It stands forfeited in favor of the school after one year and no claim will be entertained, thereafter.**
- i. The fees may be revised according to financial exigencies at the start of the session.
- j. School leaving certificate is issued only after all dues have been cleared, on payment of Rs. 200/- through Bank Challan.
- k. Fee is charged for all 12 months of each academic year from April to March for Montessori to Matric and O'Level and from August to July for class XI & XII, irrespective of the date of admission.



TEACHING OF THE HOLY QURAN

The teaching of the Holy Quran is compulsory from class I to VIII. The students of class IX and X are taught some selected SURAHS with their meanings and explanation. Regular periods of Islamiyat are held in school mosque for the students.

STUDENT AWARDS

Students are awarded certificates and / or prizes for the following achievements:

- a. Participation Certificate is given to all who participate in any co-curricular activity / sports.
- b. Merit Certificates are awarded to those who acquire meritorious positions in studies and co-curricular activities.
- c. Good conduct Certificates are awarded at the end of the year to students whose discipline had been exceptionally good.
- d. Gold Medals are awarded to the top twenty students who secure 85% or more marks in class X and Silver Medals to top twenty students in class-IX. Two top students from class XII and XI each will be given Gold and Silver Medals respectively provided they pass all subjects and secure minimum 80% marks in the aggregate. Similarly two top students each from O'3 and O'2 will be awarded Gold and Silver Medals provided they secure minimum 5 As in O'3 and 2 As for O'2 with minimum score of 88%. There should be no C grade. In case of tie all incumbents will be given the medals.

PRAYERS

ARRANGEMENTS ARE THERE TO offer Zohar Prayers by Jamat in the institution's own mosque. The students are encouraged to offer Zohar prayers in congregation.

STUDENTS' DIARIES

The students have to note down all the topics of class work done and homework given in their diaries. The diary is also a means of communication between the teachers and parents on the affairs of the students. Parents are requested to consult the diary and sign regularly any note written by the teachers. The diary will be checked by the class / subject teachers regularly.



PROMOTION CRITERION

In order to qualify for promotion to reach class, a student must obtain:

- Minimum 40% marks in each subject. (For O' Level pass percentage is 50%).
- Any student failing twice in the same class will not be retained in the School.

REPORTS TO PARENTS

The results of 1st Quarterly, Mid Term, 2nd Quarterly and Final Examinations are recorded in the student's Academic Report Books and the said Report Books are to be signed by parents. E-Report cards are also available online after two weeks of announcement of result.

PARENT-TEACHERS MEETING

Parent-Teachers Meetings, to discuss the academic and other problems of the students, are held on quarterly basis preferably after the 1st Quarterly test and Mid-Term Examinations. Dates for the same are notified through circulars and is also mentioned in the year book issued to every student at the time of admission. Parents may also visit, with prior appointment, during the visiting hours.

EDUCATIONAL TRIPS

Educational trips and excursions to places of educational interest are arranged by the school. The students proceeding on such trips are required to wear neat and clean uniforms.

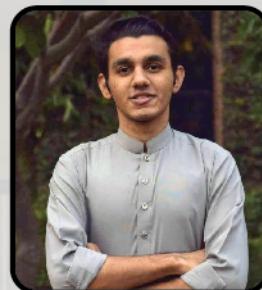

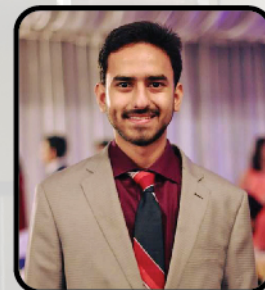

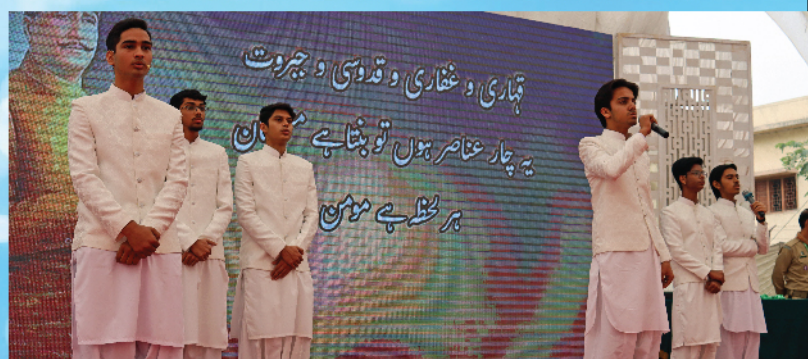
